In attempting to research the Keeney's Theatres it looks like that around 1926 Loews bought out 3 of the theaters that Frank had, as near as I can figure out the names appear to be this way.

1. **Keeney Music Hall (Keeney's Theatre)** 1915 - 1926 was located at 300 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, NY 11217 when sold 9 June 1926 it became Loews Livingston Theater then was renamed in 1928 to Loews Melba Theater which was demolished in 1954 and is now is a four level parking & commercial building.
2. **Keeney's Bay Ridge** 1921 - 1926 was located at 7120 Third Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11209 became Loews Bay Ridge Theater now it's a McDonald's and Rite Aid
3. **Keeney's Bedford Theatre** 1924 - 1926 was located at 1372 Bedford Avenue at Bergen Street Brooklyn, N.Y. 11216 became Loews Bedford Theater is now a church.

Keeney's Theater was packed to the doors last evening, because the bill being presented this week has some very popular comedians. The winsome comedienne, Patrice, in her latest success, "The Lobbyist," was clever, and the large audience showed its appreciation by loudly applauding the act. Rooney and Bent were to have appeared, but were replaced by Eddie O'Connor and Olivette Haynes in a sketch entitled "The Millinery Shop," a one-act musical comedy, full of incidents that kept the audience in an uproar. They were supported by six handsome and attractive young women who did their work well. The sketch was so interesting that it received an ovation. The lines are bright, and the playhouse rocked with laughter. Felix and Barry, Brooklyn's favorites, in "The Boy Next Door," were brought before the footlights several times. Maude De Lora, the physical culture girl, did her difficult stunts sensationally, and was loudly encored. O'Donnell brothers, musical artists, were well received. Zinelle and Boutelle, in "237 Miles from New York"; Wilbur Held, the black face comedian; the Four Comrades, acrobats, and the Keeneyscope, with new and startling pictures, shared the success.



The Brooklyn Eagle, September 20, 1921:

"The Bay Ridge Theater opened last night under the management of Frank A. Keeney, offering a film and vaudeville bill headed by Florence Reed in 'Indiscretion.'"

The Brooklyn Eagle, December 12, 1922:

"Last night was the 'great night' that saw Bay Ridge in possession of a full-fledged, first-class stock company, playing Broadway hits and bringing all the joys of the Times Square theatre section within reach of home-loving Brooklynites.

"The theatre, under the management of Frank A. Keeney, presented 'The Woman in Room 13', A. H. Wood's successful play as the first of a large repertoire of well-known plays."

The New York Times, June 10, 1926:

"Three vaudeville theatres in Brooklyn, the Keeney, Bedford and Bay Ridge, the property of Frank A. Keeney, have been bought by Marcus Loew, according to an announcement issued yesterday from Mr. Loew's offices. These three theatres have a total seating capacity of 6,000. William Ford, general manager for Mr. Keeney confirmed the announcement last night. Mr. Ford would not reveal the amount of money involved in the deal and no one in authority at the Marcus Loew offices could be reached last night."





The Bedford Theatre was built in 1913, and leased to William Fox. It was operated by Frank Keeney from 1924-1926. Loew's Inc. took over in 1926, and it operated as a premier movie palace in Brooklyn, until its closure on May 1, 1952. It was converted into a church.

The old Bedford Theatre still operates as a house of worship today, as the Washington Temple. The theater's six box seats are still intact, as is the projection booth. Among the other original touches are the many sculptures which remain in the balcony, and the domed ceiling.

Perhaps of greatest interest are the original balcony seats and the carpeting that read Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer and Loew's, which even to this day, remain intact.



The Adams Theatre presented everything from stage plays to Kung-Fu movies in its long history as one of the top theatres in downtown Newark. Its most successful period was from the late-1930's into the '1950's, first with "Big Band" stage shows supporting the movies, and then as a burlesque house with famous strippers like Blaze Starr, Tempest Storm, and Georgia Sothern.

With William E. Lehman as architect, the theatre first opened in January, 1912 as the Shubert Theatre, presenting Broadway plays and try-outs. In 1913, the name and management shifted to Payton's Theatre, followed by Keeney's Theatre, which changed the policy to vaudeville and movies. In 1931, two Greek immigrant brothers who'd adopted the family name of Adams re-christened the theatre as a monument to themselves. In addition to the Adams Theatre, they also owned the Newark Paramount and two other New Jersey theatres.

The Adams Theatre was operated by Paramount Picture Inc. in the early 1940's but was listed as (Closed) in 1941-1943. It continued as a grind movie house into the 1980's at least, and is still standing, perhaps just waiting for the next revival of the downtown Newark shopping and business district.
