She was preceded in death by two brothers, Morris and Byron Keene; one sister, Grace Keene Heffner; and a nephew, John E. Keene. Survivors include two nieces, Dorothy Harmon and her husband Bob and Betty Turner and her husband Bill; a niece-in-law, Dorothy (Doe) Keene; and several great-nieces. She was a devoted school teacher for 41 years and retired from the Chesapeake School System. She received her BA degree from Marshall College. 




COUNTIES OF KENTUCKY 1792 IN RESPECT TO MODERN COUNTIES

GOD'S COUNTRY WEST VIRGINIA



Keeney's Mountain, over which the Indians passed in their last raid into the Muddy Creek country, is still known by that name, and was named for one of the first settlers within the territory of this county, by the name of David Keene, who settled near the foot of the Greenbrier County side in 1787.

Another of the early families to settle in the Greenbrier region was the McClung family. William McClung often referred to as "Grandfather Billie" was born about 1738. He came from Rockbridge County in 1773. When the trouble with the Indians erupted in that year, he along with several others who had settled in the Kanawha Valley were forced to seek refuge closer to the forts in the Greenbrier Valley. It was not until about 1776 that he returned to his former location. In 1778 the McClung family had to retreat to the safety of a fort once again as hostilities broke out all along the frontier after the murder of Chief Cornstalk. It was at the McClung house that the Shawnee war party was overtaken and passed by John Pryor and Phillip Hammond who were attempting to reach Fort Donnally and warn them of the impending attack. Fortunately for the McClungs they had already left the fort.

Joseph and Rebecca Graham had born to them four sons and five daughters, whose names and date of birth are as follows: Florence, born January 31, 1805; Lanty, born December 8, 1806; John, born February 23, 1809; Jane, born April 6, 1811; James, born March 31, 1813; Elizabeth, born July 19, 1815; Ann, born October 16, 1818; David, born January 1, 1821; Rebecca, born December 13, 1823.

Florence, the oldest daughter, married John Nowlan, who was a native of Carrick on Suir Kilkenny county, Ireland, about 1835. After his marriage Nowlan settled about two miles southward from his father-in-law's, where he lived until his death in 1876. To them were born four children, one daughter and three sons. The oldest, Rebecca, married George W. Hedrick, [75] brother of Moses Hedrick, previously mentioned. Rebecca Hedrick died in June 1863, leaving her husband and two children, Mary F. and Patrick, the latter dying unmarried in the winter of 1884 at about the age of twenty-three years.

Joseph, the oldest son of John and Florence Nowlan, married Mary Keeney, of Kanawha county, in the spring of 1865, and now lives on the farm near Stock Yard, owned eighty years ago by his greatuncle, Samuel Graham. To them were born a large family, among whom are John C., who is now a justice of the Peace of this county; S. J., who lives at Stock Yard; Rebecca Florence, who is now the wife of Rev. C. T. Kirtner, an able Baptist minister; Kellus P., who is a telegraph operator and agent for the C. & O. R'y. Co.; Wm. C., is a practicing physician at Talcott, W. Va.; Elmer is a lawyer with [76] his office at Hinton, W. Va.; Mac is engaged in the lumber business, and those still at home are Lawrence, George, Anna and Homer John Nowlan, Jr., second son of John and Florence Nowlan, died in 1862 unmarried at the age of 22 years. He died in Fayette county from the result of exposure incident to the Civil War which was then in progress.

Patrick, the third son, was drowned January 8, 1877, while crossing Greenbrier river at Haynes' Ford, at the exact point where his great uncle, Samuel Graham, met the same fate nearly sixty years before.

Florence Nowlan died January 21, 1869, aged 64 years. John Nowlan, Sr., died November 4, 1876, having been born June 24, 1793, and was therefore in his eighty-fourth year.
