

A SPECIAL CONNECTICUT MOM

It was raining softly that morning in 1811 when Joseph Keeney died at the age of 38. At his side was his wife, Rebecca, who at 35 would face the challenge of raising their two young sons, Henry, 5, and Walter, 3. Her only means of support was their small grocery and dry-goods store beside their home at the corner of Main and Elm Streets in Hartford. Typical of her sex, Rebecca

did what so many mothers have done before and after. She coped with a sense of humor and great skill. She raised her two sons, managed the homestead, and managed the store, all very successfully.

As soon as they were able, young Henry and Walter worked beside their mother in the store. As time passed, more and more of the responsibility passed into their hands. Under their kind mother's tutelage, Henry and Walter learned the essentials of business, and as Hartford businessmen, both became very wealthy.

The lessons they learned from their extraordinary mother were never forgotten, and in 1894 Henry Keeney stipulated in his will that the homestead and store should be razed and replaced with a Victorian clock tower, designed by Charles C. Haight of New York. The purpose of this tower was carefully spelled out by Henry on the plaque that accompanies the monument:


This Tower
Erected in Memory of
My Mother

is designed to preserve from other occupancy the ground sacred to me as her home and to stand in perpetual honor of the wisdom, goodness and womanly nobility of her to whose guidance I owe my success in life and its chief glory.

This tower was the very first monument in America erected to honor a mother whose only claim to fame was her success as a parent.

(Research on this family began about 1980 and has included trips to Tennessee and to the Heart of America Genealogical Library in Kansas City, special help from family members MYRTLE ABENDROTH (Parker, AZ) and KARLA KEENEY YATES (Whitefish, MT), books on Cass Co., MO History, Jackson Co., MO, Marriages and MO Marriages to 1850, and census records from 1830 to 1920 from the appropriate states.)

THOMAS KEENEY has been a favorite name in every KEENEY generation, beginning in this research as early as September 9, 1778 in Bedford Co., VA when Thomas Keeney gave bond to Governor Patrick Henry to show his intention to marry Mary Reeves. According to Court minutes this Thomas Keeney served frequently on the grand jury in Jefferson Co., VA from 1792 to 1803 and later. In 1800 he was deeded 51 acres for \$1,000 by his brother, John (athan) Keeney, apparently the same land that had been granted to John in Greene Co. (TN county names changed as population grew) for his service in the American Revolution. In 1814-16 Thomas sold 110 acres to Francis Carter.

Thomas & Mary Reeves Keeney were parents of at least five daughters and three sons. At least two of the sons, Joseph David (David in MO records) and Peter Francis Michael (Michael in MO

Aulene Samples took this picture of the tombstone of Private George W. Keeney at Andersonville Cemetery, Georgia. He was a member of the 24th New York Battery and died in the prison of typhus fever on May 21, 1864.

A total of 12,912 Union soldiers died at Andersonville, of which 2592 came from New York, 738 from Tennessee (split sentiment there) and 288 from Virginia (probably West Virginia). A total of 4550 died on one day in October 1864.

Also buried at Andersonville are A. W. Keeney, NY Co. D, 85th Regt., 18 July 1864; J. Kenney, MA Cavalry 3, 23 August 1864; C. Kenney, MI Cavalry 5, 11 Jan 1865; William Kenney, PA 11 May 1864; and J. Kiney, RI 7 July 1864.

FORMER JAILER MERCER COUNTY KILLS YOUTH

Edward Kade, Official in Farming Administration, Shoots Grover Keeney, A Virginian Freeman

The second shooting with death as the result in two weeks time by a farming station proprietor, occurred on last Saturday night, when Edward Kade, former jailer of Mercer County, also killed Grover Keeney, Jr., 23, Virginian Freeman, at the Kade Inn, recently filling stations on the Beckley road just outside the city limits of Princeton.

Kade is now residing in the Mercer County jailhouse which he presided for four years. He has not applied for work and the chances are that he will wait until after the indictment is returned by the grand jury.

He has employed Attorney Walter Stinson to defend him as has Gossie Morris, Oakdale road proprietor who killed a young sheep herder from Pennsylvania several weeks ago.

Kade will claim and declare that he did in defense of his honor and his employees.

Attorney A. J. Coulter of Bluefield has been employed to prosecute Morris. Morris comes from Montezuma, was a prominent cattle dealer for a number

of years and the financial leader of J. C. Pennington who elected sheriff in 1922. Some rumors say he should be reelected in view of the short time past, at the corner of Ninth and Market streets which was operated by Mrs. Virginia Morris, who figures in the killing section shooting.

Some 500 witnesses to the shooting were examined by Prosecutor Justice McElroy and all testified to about the same thing with some differences in details.

The shooting climaxed an evening of fighting. It is held that young Keeney was being held from the place after a general free-for-all fight when he was shot through the heart and died instantly.

Before the shooting Keeney is said to have had a fight with a man from Virginia.

He was leaving in his car when another fight broke out in which Keeney's two sisters were involved and Virginia Morris was participating—the being badly beaten and knocked down.
